RODGER DAVIS WINS AT ANGKOR GOLF RESORT

A stunning performance by Australian veteran Rodger Davis saw him cruise to a comfortable win in the Victoria Angkor Resort Pro-Am tournament held in Siem Reap, Cambodia. The 59-year-old, who has won 28 professional tournaments all over the world during his illustrious career finished with a ten under par total of 278, a massive 13 shots ahead of his nearest rival, Steven Morshuis, an Australian PGA Senior Tour player.

This years event attracted another quality field including 15 professional golfers and 37 amateur golfers from all over Australia. They competed over four rounds on the Nick Faldo design layout, with stroke play used for the professionals, and a stableford scoring system used for the amateurs. It was the second time the Pro-Am event has been held at the award winning Angkor Golf Resort.

Angkor Golf Resort manager Adam Robertson was delighted that a player of Davis' quality signed up to compete in the Pro-Am in Cambodia, and was impressed by his outstanding display. "Rodger's play on the first day, when he shot 68, really set the tone for the standard of golf that he was going to play throughout the four days," said Robertson. "It was always on the cards that he was going to win, it was just a matter of who came second, and how many shots he would win by".

Angkor Golf Resort is located close to the world famous Angkor Wat temples in Siem Reap, Cambodia and is regarded as one of South East Asia's leading golf courses. The Nick Faldo designed masterpiece offers an excellent test of golf for players of all skill levels, and the legendary Cambodian hospitality make this a must visit golf destination.
